

Ephesians 3.20-21 - *20 Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, 21 to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.*

1. When you read v. 20, what phrase stands out to you most and why?
2. If this immeasurably more power is already at work within us, why do we often feel so weak or defeated?

God gives us His immeasurably more power, not to make our lives better, but to show the world how great He is.

3. In v. 21, Paul says that God gets the glory “in the church” and “in Christ Jesus”. Why do you think Paul couples flawed, messy and imperfect people alongside the perfect, sinless Christ as the vessels for God’s glory? What does this tell you about the high calling and purpose of our local church community?
4. Paul says that God’s glory lasts ‘throughout all generations, for ever and ever’. When you pray, are you just looking for a quick, temporary fix for today, or are you looking for God to answer in a way that leaves a legacy of faith for your kids and grandkids? Any examples?
