

Bible Study Questions

Title: Surrendered to Christ at Any Cost

Preacher: JT Young

Bible Passage: Romans 12:1-2

1. Observation

In Romans 12:1, Paul urges us to “offer your bodies as a living sacrifice.”

What stands out to you about the idea of a living sacrifice compared to the Old Testament sacrifices that were killed? How does this change the way we understand daily surrender?

2. Deeper Understanding

Romans 12:2 says, “Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.”

What are some of the “patterns of this world” that most easily shape our thinking today (especially around success, comfort, security, or control)? How does a renewed mind help us see God’s will as “good, pleasing and perfect”?

3. Personal Reflection

The sermon highlighted the tension of still holding onto certain “rights” even after saying yes to Jesus.

What is one area of your life (time, plans, money, reputation, comfort, future) where you sense you may still be negotiating with God rather than fully surrendering?

4. Connecting the Scriptures

Jesus said in Luke 9:23 that we must “take up [our] cross daily and follow” Him.

How does this daily aspect of surrender deepen or challenge what Paul writes in Romans 12:1-2? What does a “daily” living sacrifice look like in ordinary life?

5. Response & Mission

The heart of the message is moving from partial surrender to a wholehearted “Here I am, send me.”

What is one practical next step of obedience or availability God may be inviting you to take this week — whether in serving, giving, going, or simply staying on the altar in a specific area of your life?
